The Humanities Pathway

The Humanities Pathway is designed for students who enjoy the study of cultures, communication and artistic expression. Through major works of literature and philosophy, to the study of languages, art, music and theater, humanities majors develop a strong liberal arts background. (For students interested in art, music or drama, see the *Fine, Visual and Performing Arts Pathway*). Students majoring in the humanities are often described as creative, imaginative, perceptive, and original. Strong social and interpersonal skills are often required of humanities majors with an aptitude for speaking, writing and teaching. Because of the focus on cultural awareness and creative expression, a degree in the humanities provides students with a number of transferable skills that are applicable in a wide range work environments and careers.

Seattle Central Community College offers an Associate in Applied Science degree in

Technical Communications designed for students who want to enter the workforce in a relatively short time frame. Depending on articulated agreements, this program may or may not transfer to a baccalaureate degree program.

For students interested in a bachelor's degree, complete SCCC's Associate of Arts degree. Within the guidelines of the AA degree, take the recommended courses listed below to prepare for program admission. Some humanities majors are highly competitive, so we recommend that you apply to more than one school for admission. By completing the courses below, you should be well-prepared to enter most colleges and universities in and out of Washington State.

Be sure to check the admission and graduation requirements of your transfer school, as requirements often change or programs may require additional courses not offered at community colleges.
