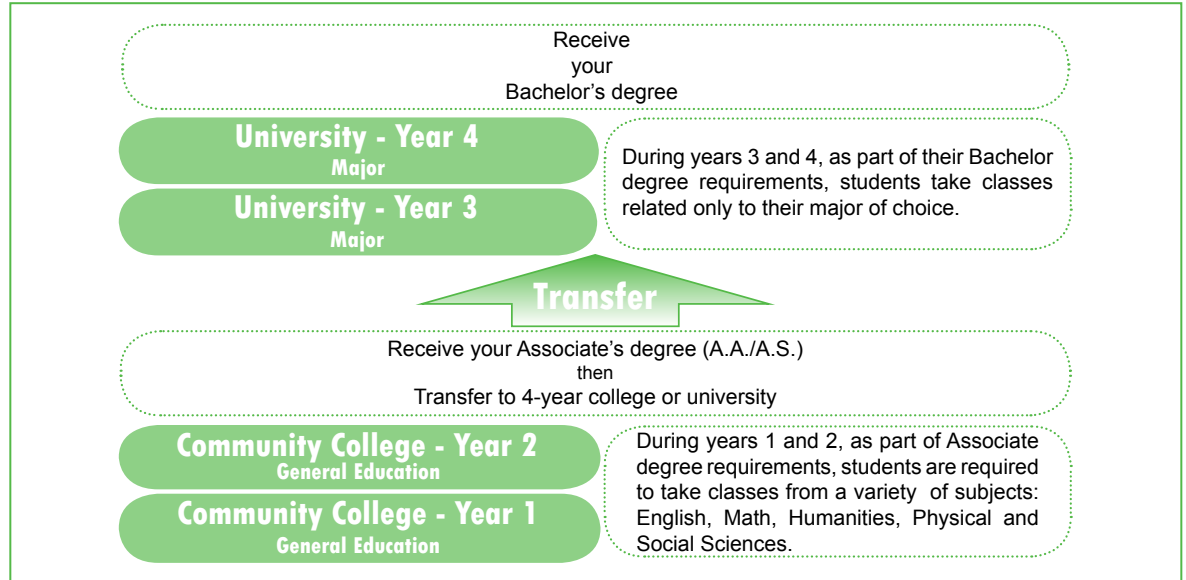


COLLEGE TRANSFER PROGRAM

In the College Transfer program at Seattle Central, students earn an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree. An Associate's degree takes two years, or 90 credits, and is transferable to a four-year college or university. After students complete their Associate's degree, they can transfer to a four-year institution and complete a Bachelor's degree by taking two more years of study in their major. College Transfer is often called the "2+2" program for this reason.

No matter the career path – becoming a doctor, teacher, accountant, lawyer, engineer, CEO -- community college remains a popular choice for American students beginning their Bachelor's degree. In fact, almost half of all American students begin their college/university careers that way.



Here are a few reasons why students choose a community college to begin their Bachelor's degree:

Tuition costs at community colleges are low compared with other colleges and universities. Study at Seattle Central for the first two years before transferring to a university and you will save thousands of dollars.

Classes at community colleges are smaller than at many state universities. At a state university, classes may have 100–300+ students in them. Class sizes at Seattle Central range from 25-40. Attending Seattle Central will allow you to receive more personal attention and greater access to your instructors.

At many universities, classes are taught by a teaching assistant (T.A.). A teaching assistant is a graduate student who earns money for college by teaching courses in the field that he/she is studying. At community colleges, instructors are professional educators, not graduate students. All Seattle Central instructors have a Master's degree or Ph.D. in their teaching field.

Low tuition + small class size + individual support + excellent faculty = most value for your money!
